Passing on the Faith -- Every Adult Needs...



To be able to be participants/lay leaders in worship.

In worship, we come together as a community of God to reflect on the gifts we are given, share the Holy Communion meal, praise God through music, have time for reflection, hear God's Word, participate in the rituals and traditions of the church and Christian community, and grow into our faith. Making space in your schedule to worship together as a family becomes an important ritual for the faith life of your family. Depending on the age of children, there may be some worship times where there are more distractions to deal with than at other times. Even during those times, it is good for children to know that they are welcome in church and in worship - there is a place and a space for them. One way that children learn this is not only to see a parent involved in worship leadership, but to be a part of that leadership as well. We have many families of various sizes and ages, that help usher, take the offering, greet, hand out bulletins, ring the bell, light the candles, etc. There are numerous opportunities, from behind-the-scenes work to reading Scripture passages during worship. When children participate, they discover that they are the church of today. When children participate, they may even seek out ways to be involved. When children participate, they encourage the rest of their families to attend worship on Sundays. When children see the important adults in their lives participate and lead, they learn that it is an important thing to do. I encourage you to talk to the children in your life about how you participate in worship and why you do it. Do you help serve at fellowship time? Do you greet and hand out bulletins? Usher? Help make communion bread? Play the organ or piano? Find our bell ringers? All of these are done in service for the community who joins together to worship. All of these are done in God's name for the sake of the community.

As we venture into another church year, we thank you for your participation and leadership in worship.

Confirmation Class 7 -8 Grade Confirmation

Our regular Confirmation classes are at **11:00am** following worship. We will meet every Sunday at this time for 1 hour. We are in the year that we cover the Bible. We will be using the reform curriculum -- *Ancestors: Old Testament and New Testament.* Each session begins with a short video and will include work in our "Anti-Workbooks." We will cover the Old Testament Ancestors

and then move into the New Testament Ancestors in January. There are 30 sessions. Attendance is essential. If you miss a Sunday, you will have to complete homework in order to receive credit for the missed session. This is different from how we previously led classes. We will discuss attendance as well as other guidelines when we meet. Letters will be mailed out with information. We do need to know who will be participating so that Bibles, Anti-Workbooks, and Catechisms can be ordered for those who need them. The Confirmation classes are for 7-8th grades, as well as any other youth who has not completed their Bible year. *(Last year was the Catechism year.)*

AGREEMENT FOR USE OF CHURCH PROPERTY

"THE QUESTION COMES UP EVER SO OFTEN – IS OUR SAVIORS "SALES TAX EXEMPT"? <u>ANSWER IS NO!</u>

FIRST: Our Saviors is a nonprofit organization. The church is not required to file an "income tax form" pursuant to section 501 (c 3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

SECOND: The church has a Federal ID#, which is used to open an account at a financial institution and when filing and paying our quarterly payroll taxes.

THIRD: Our Saviors and the parsonage have a "Property tax exemption", which is maintained with filing a certain form with Custer County.

"Even though *Our Saviors* is a nonprofit under 501 (c3) and the buildings and land are exempt from paying real estate taxes, these exemptions **DOES NOT** make *Our Saviors* automatically "exempt" from sales tax (this is a State of South Dakota tax)."


FOURTH: Taken from SD Sales Tax Guide: Pgs 8-10

Exempt Entities include:

Indian Tribes // US Government Agencies // State of SD // Public or municipal corporations of the State of SD// Municipal or volunteer fire or ambulance depts.// Public schools // Non-profit hospitals // Relief agencies // SD Religious and private schools, (*Our Saviors D.O.G. Night* does not qualify).

Taxable Transactions: (list is not all inclusive):

SALES TO: Churches // Membership organizations such as YMCA, Boys and Girls Scouts // Civic and Nonprofit organizations // Schools, colleges & religious, Benevolent, fraternal & charitable organizations for fundraisers.


