THE CANDY. The day of Resurrection was thought of as an entry into paradise. In the Hebrew Scriptures, when you enter paradise, you receive milk and honey and other festive foods. The candy is a modern playing out of the more ancient milk and honey.

THE BUNNY. The treat-toting Easter bunny seems to have been born in Germany in the late 1600's. Children would build nests for the bunny to leave their treats in - the origin of the modern Easter basket.

COLORED EGGS. The ancient Egyptians exchanged red-colored eggs in honor of spring. This custom spread to the Greeks and Romans and then to the Europeans. In medieval times, eggs were forbidden during Lent, making them a popular treat on Easter Sunday.

Church The council will be accepting Council bids for the church cleaning job. This opportunity will first be offered to congregation members as well as the



'Wouldn't you know it,' Bobby fumed, 'the one Sunday I don't go and he shows up.'

Mission of the Month New Life for Exploited Girls

Millions of children—most of them girls—are enslaved in the global sex trade today. Many, like Chanty*, are forced to serve several "clients" every day. They're often drugged and beaten if they don't obey.

"They told me they {would} kill me if I tried to leave," remembers Chanty. Orphaned and alone at age 12, Chanty was thrilled when a foreign man asked her to go for a boat ride to an island. "It never entered my mind that he would do anything bad to me," she said. "He forced me, and he hit me." Terrified and ashamed, she was grateful when a woman offered her a job in a restaurant. But it was a trap. She had been sold into prostitution. Amazingly, Chanty escaped, and the police brought her to the World Vision Trauma Recovery Center, where she benefited from counseling and loving support, and learned skills she can use to be self-sufficient.
