And the Call is to Community...

I write this article in the midst of planning for Holy Week while listening to Michael Card's song "The Basin and the Towel". I am once again struck by the powerful words of this song. Jesus' ministry is truly one of community. He did not come to save one or two people individually. He came to save a whole community and he calls us to be a part of that community.

A co-worker stopped me recently and said "I am not really religious but more spiritual. My husband and I worship God on our own. Is it really important that we go to church?" I get this question a lot. There is usually more to the question than meets the eye. My response is honest, simple and from the heart.

Is it important to go to church? As a pastor one would expect me to say "yes, absolutely" end of response. But that does not reach the depth of this very important question. Is it important to go to church and be a part of a community of faith? Yes, I believe it is. Not just as a pastor but more so as a child of God. Not because it is the law. Not because you receive gold stars or brownie points for earning your way to heaven. It is important because God calls us to be part of a community of faith. In order to grow in life and faith, we need to hear the word of God and participate in the sacraments. We need to surround ourselves with other believers who can support us and pray for us and model for us our faith. We need to do the same for them. We need to gather to build each other up so that we can go out into our communities, no matter where they are, to be the hands and feet and voice and face of God to those we encounter every day. We gather in worship because God is a relational God and calls us to be in relationship not only with him but with others. We gather together in worship because sometimes I can't pray or believe or have the strength to go another day and I need you, my community of faith, to pray for me and believe for me and carry me until I can walk upright again. We gather in worship because it is NOT all about us as individuals. It IS about us as a community, working together as one body of faith with Christ as the head. Can I worship God alone? Absolutely. That is part of my devotion time. Can I commune with God in nature? You bet. That is also important. Can that be all I do? No way because then you have a one note faith and you don't have the opportunity to become the whole child of God that God wants you to be.

And the call is to community... We gather in worship hoping to gain enough strength to make it through the next six days before we will gather again to be refilled and rejuvenated and head out into our every day lives again. We gather in worship because others need us to be there. We gather in worship because God calls us to be there.

Thank you, my faith family, for gathering together each week in worship as part of one community.





The upstairs sanctuary of our church was built in 1963. About that time, Bennie Spring, Don and Walter Neugebauer went to a church that had been closed in the Watertown area to pick up pews that were given to our church. The pews were loaded into the back of a truck. They filled oats around them to keep them from rubbing together and scratching each other. One of the remaining pews sits in the entryway of the church today.

They also gave us the *picture of the Good Shepherd* that now hangs in the sanctuary. In 1997, when the new entry and bathroom were added to the church, Don Shaeffer framed the picture and it was hung where it is today.



Every church has volunteers who work tirelessly for the ministry. They don't do it for the recognition or the fanfare. They're motivated by a deep devotion to Christ-like service and a love for others. But that doesn't mean they don't appreciate an occasional pat on the back or a round of applause.

What is "Prayer Shawl Ministry"?

Simply put, a Prayer Shawl is a soft, warm shawl or lap robe knitted or crocheted, which is given to a person who is ill, has suffered a loss, or is in the midst of a crisis.

Jesus is the reason!




Mission of the Month HERMOSA BASEBALL PROGRAM
