Youth Group will meet the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month.


All youth 6-12 grades are invited to attend.

2015 South Dakota Synod Assembly Report

The theme of which was "LISTEN! God is calling"

Bishop Zellmer opened the Assembly stating: "If we don't get our children involved, there will be No Church!

This was my first Synod Assembly. A gathering of over 500 working hard on our behalf to keep and find new programs, ministries, missions, campus outreach, and financing help for seminary students.

OSL is in the Bear Butte Conference which includes Outlaw Ranch.

65% of seminary students have at some time participated in outdoor activities such as Lutherans Outdoors.

60% of the Synod attendees, some 500 plus people, have participated on Outdoor Activities. Camping, etc. We are asked to consider the Lutherans Outdoors for our families.

Speaking was a pastor from the Lutheran Church in Camaroon discussing their work. They minister to 2500+ and growing fast.

Celebrating 25 years of ministry for the Lutheran Church in Nicaragua, now our Companion Synod.



Mission of the Month for July The Family of Rob Whitehead

Rob Whitehead was diagnosed with colon cancer in July of 2014. Until that time he was a loving husband and father with 4 young children at home, living east of Hermosa and providing for his family by driving truck out of North Dakota. After he was diagnosed with cancer, he was not able to work as he had to be in Rapid City for treatments once a week. He was also treated at Mayo Clinic, MD Anderson in Texas, and the Cancer Treatment Center of America in Chicago, where he and his wife Lindsay spent the last month of his life. Rob died in June, 2015.
