#### *Treasures* "His mother [Mary] treasured all these things in her heart." Luke 2:51b

Treasures. We all have them. Items that have great meaning to us for a number of reasons. They might have financial value or they might have sentimental value or both but no matter what we keep them close to us.

Treasures, however, aren't always something we can touch and feel. As with Mary, there are many things that we treasure in our hearts. Shared experiences. Words that are spoken. When I look back at 2015, I will most definitely treasure my time with all of you as an interim pastor at Our Saviors Lutheran Church. Thank you for welcoming me into your lives and showering me with prayers and support. Thank you for helping me to learn the culture of this area and forgiving me when I made mistakes. ## **Better Choices Better Health**

This is a self-management workshop for anyone who lives with a chronic condition or for caretakers of someone who has a chronic condition. Workshops go 6 weeks 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hours and are led by trained leaders.

The emphasis of the curriculum is not designed to help people learn more about the chronic conditions but rather *to learn skills and tools to better manage those conditions*.

You will learn such skills as managing your symptoms, communicating better, dealing with anger and depression, designing a healthy eating plan, managing pain and fatigue, problem solving, relaxation and stress management, and appropriate use of medications.

This program is being instituted in South Dakota by the SD Department of Health and SDSU Extension.

Other partners include SD Department of Social Services, Regional Hospital, Avera and Sanford Health Systems, and numerous other organizations. Workshops in Hermosa and Custer will be scheduled for late January or early February. You may register at this website, www.betterchoicesbetterhealthsd.org.


# **Bibles for the Growing Church**
