#### **Better Choices Better Health**

This is a self-management workshop for anyone who lives with a chronic condition or for caretakers of someone who has a chronic condition. Workshops go 6 weeks 2 ½ hours and are led by trained leaders.

The emphasis of the curriculum is not designed to help people learn more about the chronic conditions but rather to learn skills and tools to better manage those conditions.

You will learn such skills as managing your symptoms, communicating better, dealing with anger and depression, designing a healthy eating plan, managing pain and fatigue, problem solving, relaxation and stress management, and appropriate use of medications. This program is being instituted in South Dakota by the SD Department of Health and SDSU Extension.

Other partners include SD Department of Social Services, Regional Hospital, Avera and Sanford Health Systems, and numerous other organizations.

# Mission of the Month Lutheran World Relief School Kits



Our Savior's WELCA is putting together school kits to be sent to needy children all over the world through Lutheran World Relief. This month our Mission will be to team up with WELCA and support this project.

Why school supplies? To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford.

Money donated will be used to purchase any supplies needed to complete the kits, make or purchase cloth bags required for each kit, and help with postage. (It costs LWR about \$1.40 per School Kit to deliver it overseas.)
