Like A Child

"People were bringing even infants to Jesus that he might touch them; and when the disciples saw it, they sternly ordered them not to do it. But Jesus called for them and said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." Luke 18:15-17

I write this newsletter article as I listen to my three-year-old granddaughter 'read' a book and run after Brownie declaring "Puppy likes me" while my other granddaughter attempts to watch a movie on TV. I have been blessed this past two weeks to spend quite a bit of time with the younger members of my family; my daughter, my grandchildren, my nieces and nephew. I am reminded once again of how God created the minds of young children to work. Not afraid to constantly ask questions and wonder about all that they see (sometimes to the frustration of the adults around them). Soaking in all that is around them and being open to hear explanations that may seem simple to the adult mind but make perfect sense to them. Willing to step out in faith into new adventures and experiences, trusting that someone will be there to catch or support them. Not afraid of much (again sometimes to the frustrations of the adults around them). Believing that the world is basically good even when they fall down and get hurt. Seeing God in the little things and not being afraid to tell others all about what they have seen and heard and experienced! These qualities are what I think of when I hear these verses. These 'childlike' qualities that allow us to wonder and question and see God in the little things. These qualities that allow us to receive the kingdom of God that has been set before us. Oh how I wish we could retain more of these 'childlike' qualities when we are required to be adults.

I invite all of you to journey with me this summer as we rediscover some of these childlike qualities. After all, isn't that what summer is all about. Finding time to be a child again! As part of this journey, we will bring some of those children's summer activities into worship. On June 5th, we will begin a "Barnyard Round-up" worship series using the themes from this year's VBS to guide us into a deeper childlike faith focusing on Psalm 23 and various Bible stories as Jesus gathers us together. Following this series, we will join all of the campers at our Lutheran Outdoor camps this summer in their Bible Study for an "In It, Not Of It" worship series where we will explore Romans 12:2 and how we can be Christians in the world but not of it. I look forward to worshipping with you as we journey through these series this summer when we have permission to be more childlike in our faith and life and be a part of something bigger than us. I am excited to see how the Holy Spirit works through this time.

I know that summer also brings a time of coming and going for all of you as well. I encourage you to find a place to worship no matter where you end up. As you have questions and wonderments, don't forget to share them with me and they will appear as part of my Monday Reflections post.

May the peace of God be with you as summer begins and may you have the opportunity to make many childlike memories and experience many childlike God moments.

WELCA will meet June 14th at the parsonage at 9:30am.




Pastor Deb will be our hostess.


DONATIONS FOR TANZANIA



Mission of the Month for June


GOD'S GLOBAL BARNYARD
