"I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." Romans 12:1-2

Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

Paul is speaking these words to Christians who were trying to figure out what it means to live this new life as a follower of Jesus. To live a life structured by the power of *grace* instead of being structured by the power of sin and the world around them. To live a life in the world but not of the world.

This struggle continues for us today no matter how young or old we are or how long we have lived as a Christian. The staff at Lutheran Outdoors in South Dakota recognized this and developed their 2016 Bible Study "In It, Not Of It" around this struggle with Romans 12:2 as their theme verse. In the introduction to the Bible study they write:

How "IN THE WORLD" could this possibly work? How "IN THE WORLD" could you even begin to imagine a God who is present with us in the midst of war, poverty, hate and destruction? How "IN THE WORLD" can God's grace possibly be big enough for me or you or the people who are in the headlines? How "IN THE WORLD" could strength come through weakness? How "IN THE WORLD" can I even begin to make a difference in this messed up world?

Here's the deal - we may very well be IN the world, but we are not OF the world - we are "In It, Not Of It." What does this mean? Well, it means that, through the cross, God has turned everything upside down. God brings light in darkness, fullness in emptiness, strength in weakness. Take everything the world says, and flip it over.

As we continue our summer journey rediscovering some childlike qualities and childlike faith, we will join the LOSD staff and campers in digging deeper into Paul's words and explore together what it means to be IN this world but not OF it. We will see that we can have hope in the midst of overwhelming odds. We can have peace knowing that with NO exceptions we are accepted. We can have strength in the gifts God has given us. We have love to just give away with reckless abandon. We can have faith and the world can't take away any of it!

As a Christmas present, a man received a new car from his brother. Shortly after getting it, he decided to take it for a drive. A little boy was looking at the care as he got in.

I go to many funerals because I firmly believe in their ability to heal hearts and value lives. But I also go because of the lessons I learn.

As I left Judi's funeral, I found myself thing: "Wow. I wish I could be a friend like that." How about you?


What a wonderful group of volunteers we had for VBS this year.

JULY MISSION OF THE MONTH Roger's Medical Journey


ROGER DOWNEN, a charter member of Our Saviors Lutheran, grew up in the Fairburn area. In the year of 1958, when Our Saviors Lutheran Church first started, Roger's "cigar-type-hat" was used as the first collection plate!



Roger was diagnosed in September of 2015 with cancer. He received treatments in Rapid City; then around first of April he went to Rochester (Mayo Clinic) for further treatments. He remained in that area until the end of May when he came home for the recovery process. He found a place to reside while going through the various stages of the treatment-process. One of his sisters, Barbie or Nancy, was always with him.

During the month of May, Roger celebrated TWO birthdays. One was his "stem-cell birth" (where his previously –harvested-stem-cells were put back into his system); the other was his 60th birthday at the end of May!! Through his journey, he has known "tough" days, where knowing the LOVE of God, is what carried him though. Roger has talked about the great treatment he received at Mayo Clinic, especially with the nurses, and the importance of keeping his stress level down.

In his medical journey, Roger has incurred many expenses, many of which will not be covered by insurance. As a family of faith, we have a chance to support him financially through our mission of the month. Please keep him in your prayers during his recovery time. Your support is greatly appreciated.
