The old labels we once used to identify ourselves—labels like Jew or Greek, slave or free—are no longer useful. We need something larger, more comprehensive." 1 Corinthians 12:

#### Dear Family of Faith,

I have been wrestling with these words from Paul this past month as I see, hear about and experience life in our community, our state, our nation and around the world and as I continue to learn what it means to lead this wonderful community of faith that is Our Savior's Lutheran Church. What does it mean today that in our baptism we have said good-bye to our partial and piecemeal lives? How is it that we are living out our lives not as individuals as part of something larger, integrated not only with this community of faith but with our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world? How is it that even though we are told that the old labels are not longer useful, we still fall into the trap of using labels like us and them, those people and these people? Still find ways to put fellow human beings into some sort of box that seems to exclude them from things we don't think they deserve for whatever reason. Even trying to keep them from God's love and God's desires for all of His children—to live life fully as beloved and redeemed children of God who are fearfully and wonderfully made. I admit, my brothers and sisters in Christ, I have been struggling with these questions. I wonder how I can be a better person and make a difference as an individual as well as how we as a church are being called to step up and use our voices and actions to make a difference in our community and beyond. Given what is going on in the world today, I don't think we can remain voiceless. God's love is desperately needed by too many people.

So, Family of Faith, we are involved in some wonderful ministries. I don't want those to go away. I do, however, desire us as a family of faith to move forward as one body instead of several piecemeal parts. As I was moving through the call process, I read on the goals and dreams of this congregation on your Ministry Profile which the Call Committee worked hard to put together. Have these changed? What are your hopes for this congregation in the next five years? What is this congregation passionate about? What are you willing to work together as one body of faith to achieve? Just like any family unit, we won't agree on everything but what can we do together to make a difference in our community and beyond? Where do our voices need to be heard?

I don't expect an answer to these questions right this minute. The Table Talk Gatherings which were postponed from last spring will be happening during September 11 - 30. These and other questions will be a part of those conversations. Until then, I would like you to think about these questions and discuss them with those closest to you. How is God calling you to respond to the cries of His children?

# Synod Assembly Report

Dennis and Kathy Thompson and Pastor Deb Grismer represented Our Saviors Lutheran at the Synod Assembly on June 3 and 4, 2016. The assembly was held at Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer in Watertown with over 400 people in attendance. Worship was held each day before the Assembly began and on Friday, Pastor Deb participated in leading the worship.

The Assembly is a great opportunity to remind ourselves that we are part of a larger church. Of the income received by the Synod, 45% goes to support church wide Mission. In addition, over 20% goes to support ministries in the state such as Campus Ministry, Lutheran Social Services and Lutheran Outdoors. Our contribution to the Synod is how we as a local congregation join with others to make a difference in the world.

Presenters spoke on the evangelical nature of our Lutheran Church. The Church of the future will be more multi-cultural and inclusive. It will also not necessarily expect new members to just "show up" at church, but will go where the people are. Examples such as "church on the street" were given, where pastors go out to the homeless in a number of cities. One of the comments was "the church of the future might not look like our church now, but it was never our church. It is God's church".

Even though the sessions were long, the speakers were very engaging and time goes quickly. Breaks are frequent and give the opportunity to visit with other church members from across the state. Attending the Assembly was a good experience. Kathy and I want to thank OSL for sending us as representatives. We would also encourage other to be delegates in the future and enjoy the experience.

# Mission of the Month



If you live in the Hermosa/Hayward area and call 911 for a fire, accident or medical emergency, the first to respond will probably be the local Fire Department. These two Fire Departments are manned by volunteers.

Even though Hermosa and Hayward do not have an "ambulance vehicle" for medical emergencies, they are the "first responders" with medical supplies and equipment and a trained EMT, able to stabilize the situation. It usually takes the Rapid City Ambulance, with trained paramedics on board, approximately 12-15 minutes to get to Hermosa. (Side Note: Per a member of their Board of Directors, Hermosa is in a Fire District and we need to be in an Ambulance District in order to have an ambulance and trained paramedics, and this would raise our tax dollars)

Donations during August will be split between Hermosa and Hayward Fire Departments. Funds will be used toward the purchase of an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) at the Hermosa Fire Department, plus CPR mannequins, medical supplies, and further training for our firefighters at both departments.

Remember Custer County Fair is around the corner, so come out for the Sunday parade and give support and cheers to our firefighters as they go by in their big trucks (P.S. they throw out good candy!)
