Matthew 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, “Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.” When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, “In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

‘And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.’ ”

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, “Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.” When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. Mission of the Month

Cornerstone Rescue Mission



According to a December 23 post by KOTA TV News, there are usually 90 men a night housed at the mission on Main Street. But when it gets cold, they see an uptick in that number by as many as 50 people, some sleeping on mats on the floor wherever they can fit. Nobody is turned away in the cold.



The Women and Children's home provides shelter and assistance to an average of 350-400 homeless women and children annually, and provides a yearly average of 9500 overnight stays. The home allows these women and children a chance for stability and healing while becoming self-sufficient and independent.

For less than \$25 a day, they can provide three meals, clothing, shelter, case management, transportation to and from jobs, provision for personal needs items, and Biblical counseling. Your contribution can significantly impact the lives of those in need.
