Jesus taught about the importance of matching our words and actions. This is a game we play at camp frequently that is all about actions. Our actions show others what's important to us. We want our actions to show how we follow God.

Choose a volunteer to be the guesser. Send them out of the room for a minute. Have the rest of the players stand or sit in a circle. Choose a volunteer to be the leader. The leader starts an action and the rest of the group repeats that action. Invite the guesser to come back and stand in the middle of the circle being able to look around at everyone in the group. The leader changes actions every few moments. The rest of the group follows the leader's new action. The guesser has to guess who the leader is. Once the guesser figures out the leader, repeat the game with a new guesser and a new leader.

Examples of actions: clap hands, pat head, stomp
