

#### Mission of the Month-Tornado Relief-Lutheran Disaster Response Dec 20-Jan 2

On the night of Dec 10 and early morning of Dec 11, an outbreak of over 30 tornadoes swept through six states. So far, 88 people hare reported dead across 5 states, at least 75 of them are in Kentucky. Homes and businesses were destroyed, and in some areas electricity and water systems will take weeks to repair.

Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with the Indiana-Kentucky Synod and other partners in the area to access the damage and develop immediate and long-term response plans. Given the initial damage assessments, recovery will likely take years, and Lutheran Disaster Response is prepared to accompany survivors until the response is complete.


