Welcome to this service for Maundy Thursday. In this service we remember that when Jesus institutes the first Lord’s Supper, he grants forgiveness to his disciples through the bread and wine. When we receive the bread and wine of Communion in remembrance of him, we receive that forgiveness and in turn forgive others.

OPENING DIALOGUE

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

This day recalls the events with our Lord in the Upper Room – the last meal Jesus would eat with his disciples before his death. The meal during which Jesus would wash the feet of his disciples, give a new commandment that we love one another as he says “Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.” The meal during which we hear the words for the first time “This is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.”

We have come together not just to remember, but to respond to his call to pray, to serve one another and to receive his presence in the Holy Supper.

The cup of blessing that we bless,

Is it not a participation in the blood of Christ?

The bread that we break,

Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?

Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body,

For we all partake of the one bread.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Jesus said, “Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.”

Forgiving Lord, we confess that we find ourselves cherishing your forgiveness, yet we seek to avoid forgiving those who

sin against us. Forgive our need to carry grudges, to count the injuries done to us while failing to see and confess the failings in ourselves. Forgive blindness to the hurts and needs of others while we tend to our own broken promises and broken intentions. Fill us with your heart of compassionate forgiveness and make us those who heal and encourage our loved ones. Fill us with the Spirit so that we might overflow with the serving that proclaims your very presence with us.

I have the honor and privilege, by the grace of God, of announcing to you the entire forgiveness of your sins. In Jesus Christ, you are forgiven and free—free to share the steadfast love of God with all.
