

"What is Reformation Sunday?" This is a great question asked by people of all ages and faiths. Janet Mulroney Clark offers the following explanation in her article "What Is the Meaning of Reformation Sunday?" found at www.classroom.synonym.com.

For Lutherans and many other Protestants in America, the last Sunday in October is celebrated as Reformation Sunday. Reformation Sunday honors Martin Luther's bold action on October 31st, 1517. On that date Luther posted his statement of faith, known as the 95 Theses, on the door of Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, thus beginning the Protestant Reformation. In some parts of Europe, Reformation Day is a civil holiday celebrated on October 31st, a day to commemorate the vast social and political change that resulted from Luther's actions.

Who was Martin Luther?

Martin Luther, born in 1483 in Eisleben, Germany, to a devout Catholic family, was a scholarly, serious man. He attended the university in Erfurt and studied the law, but instead of working as a lawyer, he entered an Augustinian monastery and was ordained as a monk in 1507. Luther was tortured by his fear of hell, which drove him to endless good works and acts of piety, as well as self-flagellation and other acts of penance, such as lying in the snow for long periods of time on winter nights. Through reading the Bible, however, Luther came to believe people were saved not by good works or acts of penance, but through their faith in Jesus Christ.

Papal Indulgences and Other Issues

Luther was troubled by the corruption of the Roman Catholic Church, especially the selling of indulgences. The Catholic church sold papal indulgences which they claimed would eliminate the need for acts of penance in this life and in the hereafter. He was especially bothered by the sale of jubilee indulgences, which Pope Leo X sold, in part to pay for St. Peter's Cathedral. Luther became increasingly convinced that salvation came through faith alone, not works.

The 95 Theses

Martin Luther was a professor of theology. He was a monk and a devout Catholic with no intentions of starting a new church. He did, however, want to reform the church, and with that goal in mind, Luther wrote the 95 Theses, which detailed his objections to the selling of indulgences and its effect upon the people. He posted them on the door of the church because that was a common place for posting public notices. Within weeks, however, word of the theses had spread. Consequently, Luther was viewed by the church as a heretic, threatened with burning at the stake, and excommunicated by Pope Leo in 1520. Many theologians agreed with Luther, however, and the Protestant Reformation began.

Reformation Sunday Today

Reformation Sunday in the United States is celebrated as a day to honor the root beliefs of Protestant Christianity: that faith in Christ is all that's needed for salvation, and the Bible, not any human leader, is the true authority in matters of faith. As Luther said when questioned about his views, "Unless I am convinced by Scripture and plain reason -- I do not accept the authority of the popes and councils, for they have contradicted each other -- my conscience is captive to the word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. God help me. Amen."

I am grateful to Luther and all of the Christian reformers who sacrificed so much to bring about the changes in the church that needed to happen so that people could grow in faith and learn about God, who is to be feared, but is also a God of love and grace. As we move forward in this time of post-Christendom, recognizing the scary reality that our church needs to re-form once again to continue to proclaim the Gospel, it is good for us to be reminded this movement is part of our history. Thank you for journeying with me during this difficult time.



Committee Updates:

Property Committee

*Thank you for the great work done for God's Work. Our Hands. Sunday. About 60% of projects that we had listed were completed. Extra kudos to Steve & Patti Pendegraft for all their extra work. We have received compliments from community members on how nice our yard looks.

*Bell tower still in progress.

*Recommended at next meeting the committee visits about snow removal. Pastor Deb will check with the school to see if they are willing to remove snow Monday – Thursday.

Outreach Committee

Mission Committee

*\$1105.00 was given to the Hermosa Senior Meals program through the August Mission of the Month.

- *Conversation was held around COVID protocols.

Education Committee

*The first two weeks of DOG Night have been chaotic but successful. We currently have 50 children registered and/or have attended at least one week. Approximately 20 adults are involved in this ministry.

Council Action/Decisions:

- *Mike Baschnagel has been authorized to purchase Quick Books online as soon as practical.
- *Pastor Deb will visit with Josie about adding bookkeeping responsibilities to the Administrative Assistant Position Description, as recommended by Mike and Council members. This will require additional hours be added to the Admin Assistant position as well. This will be part of the discussion at the Annual Meeting in January.
- *Committees need to start planning for 2022, especially around any financial needs they may have.
- *Discussion was held on adding a stipend for the Treasurer to the 2022 Financial Mission Plan.
- *Pastor Deb recommended a raise for Kendra (our cleaner) and 2 weeks paid vacation be added to Josie's compensation package.
- *We will keep our current COVID Protocols in place.
- *Committees are highly encouraged to look ahead in their planning to January March. If any assistance or information is needed from Pastor Deb before she goes on sabbatical, please let her know as soon as possible.
- *Pastor Deb has asked Council members and the congregation pray for leaders needed for this season in our congregation to step forward to fill the three Council positions and one alternate position which will be open in January.





PINE RIDGE ENERGY ASSISTANCE MATCHING FUND PROGRAM

The Energy Assistance Matching Fund is exactly what the title says. If someone on the Pine Ridge Reservation is in need of assistance with energy bills, they can apply at the Pine Ridge Reconciliation Center for matching funds. This means whatever money they have available to put towards their energy bill can be matched with money from the fund if funds are available and the criteria are met. The matching funds are sent directly to energy company to ensure they are used to pay the energy bill.
