Pastor Deb's Sabbatical Reflections

The idea of a sabbatical has biblical origins. The very root of the word is the same as that of "Sabbath" — a time of rest. Throughout the Old Testament God instructs people to work six days and rest on the seventh. In Leviticus, God instructs people to allow the land to rest every seventh year — meaning no farming, no planting, no harvesting. Jesus, who frequently sought out a quiet place where he could meditate and pray, away from the constant demands of the crowds, is a strong model for a sabbatical.

It is recommended rostered leaders (pastors and deacons) in the SD Synod be eligible for a six week to three-month sabbatical every five years of continuous service to a congregation. Unlike a vacation, a sabbatical is intended for purposeful reflection and restoration. The leader steps away from congregational responsibilities for a measured time which creates space for creativity, rest, and renewal. This does not happen during a vacation as the pastor is still 'on' and continues to have congregational responsibilities.

I am blessed to have just finished a two-month sabbatical. I am very grateful to Pastor Duane, Josie, Conni, Carla, Committee members and Council members who stepped forward to cover my pastoral responsibilities while was gone. I am grateful for the whole congregation who knew how much I needed this time away, prayed for me while I was gone, didn't contact me and continued with the wonderful ministry to which God has called us. Thank you from the bottom of my heart.

Rest. Reflect. Renew. Recharge. Define. Refine. Align.

In a nutshell, this is what I did on my sabbatical. I rested and slept (a lot). I renewed connections with family and friends. (I put about 5,000 miles on my vehicle.) I recharged through attending the Moses Project January Gathering and spending time with God, my husband, pets and nature. I was attending worship at different congregations, including being able to worship with my family on the Sunday morning my nephew and Godson had his First Communion Milestone. I read and went to movies. I binge-watched TV shows and cleaned at least part of the house. It was marvelous!

I spent much time reflecting on my ministry as a pastor, the ministry of Our Savior's Lutheran Church and the future of both. This was and is not easy work for me as God seems to still not give me obvious written answers. We are in an incredibly difficult time as church leaders, and we are getting worn out. However, the need is great. I wonder if I am still called to serve as a pastor. I wonder if I have the knowledge and energy needed to lead God's people during this time of transition and transformation.

I do not have the answers to all my wonderments but this I do know — We cannot go back to what was before. For many reasons, "getting back to normal", whatever that looks like is not an option. I have made many mistakes as your pastor. I name and claim them and I ask for your forgiveness. I do not want to go back and make those same mistakes. I don't want to be stuck in the past. I want to move forward. I also name and claim that I cannot go back to being the same pastor I was when I started at OSL seven years ago as your interim and then regularly called pastor. I can no longer try to work harder to be enough. I need to build better boundaries for my sake and for your sake.

As we move forward, it is important for me to define who I am as a pastor right now in this time and place. It is important for me to refine what this looks like and align what this looks like to meet the needs of my calling to OSL. It is also important for us a congregation to define who we are as a congregation now in this time and place. It is important to refine our ministry based on this definition and align our mission in our daily work to align with this ministry. It is time for us to truly breath, take a reality check and move forward. This will be challenging work but we are blessed to be doing it together. We will make mistakes but there is grace for that. God doesn't expect us to be perfect or have all the answers. God does want us to stay focused on God and continue to seek God's guidance in the proclaiming the good news and living out God's love for all of us.







Sunday Worship Series – Spiritual Integrity Sunday Mornings @ 9:30am

In ancient times, when a potter needed to sell a pot that was not perfect, they would cover the crack with wax and then paint over the flaw in the pot. An unknowing buyer would not be able to see the flaw hidden by the wax. However, if a wise buyer simply held the pot up to the light, the flaw would be visible and the buyer would know the pot did not have integrity. The root of the word "integrity" means "without wax." As we are held up to the light of Christ, our flaws become visible and our "integrity" can be examined. There are many things in life that serve as "wax" to cover our flaws and make us appear better than we really are. In this series we will explore spiritual integrity and examine those things that hide the broken places of our life. A clay pot begins in dust and as water, shape, and fire are added it can become a vessel with integrity. This is our Lenten journey.
